# University of Oregon SCHOLARSHIPS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International Affairs, University of Oregon awards over one million dollars in scholarships to UO international students each year. Tuition, cash and work study awards are available. Selection is based on financial need and academic merit

- International Cultural Service Program (ICSP): ~30 new tuition scholarships ranging from \$6,000 \$20,000. (Cultural service requirement for recipients.)
- International Dean's Excellence Award (IDEA): ~40 tuition scholarships ranging from \$4,000 \$6,000. (Awarded to new students only based on GPA. No application necessary.)
- International Affairs Endowed Scholarships: ~20 cash scholarships ranging from \$1,000 \$10,000. (Some scholarships are country-specific.)
- International Student Work-Study Program: ~80 work-study awards ranging from \$500-\$3,000. (*On-campus employment is required.*)

# Financial Aid SPRING 2011 ATTENDANCE FORMS

Please come to the Financial Aid Office to get your attendance forms if you have completed registration process and do not plan to add any courses. If you plan to add courses you may come to our office starting January 17<sup>th</sup> to get your attendance form. Deadline for Attendance forms for Spring is April 27<sup>th</sup>; failure to meet deadline will result in awaiting grades to be posted in order to be batched.

**<u>REMINDER</u>**: The financial aid office will ONLY process financial aid for students that have the following:

- a. Complete Financial Aid application (Apply online <a href="www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a>) ASCC School Code 010010; takes a minimum of 3 business days for ASCC to receive application.
- b. High School transcript (required only for students that have graduated after 1/1/05)
- c. Copies of the following documents provided by Originals:
  - i. High School diploma / Transcripts
  - ii. Local Government ID
  - iii. Birth Certificate and/or US Passport
  - iv. Social Security Card
  - d. Attendance form (complete with signatures from instructors)

#### INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

#### Sought for Summer 2011 Undergraduate Scholars

The NOAA Office of Education (OEd) is seeking NOAA offices and programs nationwide to host Undergraduate Scholarship recipients in the Educational Partnership Program (EPP) and Hollings Scholarship Program. Internship opportunities are sought for 150 scholarship recipients to participate in a 9-week OEd paid internship in NOAA mission-related research, technological, policy, management, and education activities, beginning May 31, 2011.

Starting October, 1, 2010, scholarship recipients will begin exploring the internship opportunities posted. Scholars must select an internship by April 1, 2011.

Undergraduate scholars are U.S. citizens and full-time undergraduate students majoring in NOAA mission-related disciplines, including, but not limited to, oceanic, environmental, and atmospheric sciences, mathematics, engineering, remote sensing technology, physical and social sciences including, geography, physics, hydrology, and teacher education. Scholarship recipients receive an OEd-funded award that includes academic assistance, a 10-week paid internship, housing assistance, conference travel, and round-trip travel to the internship site.

Host offices are requested to identify a discrete project that the undergraduate scholar can complete within a 9-week timeframe. Internship opportunities must be submitted in the Student Scholarship Internship Opportunity (SSIO) on-line system. The SSIO is open for past and potential NOAA mentors to view, update, delete, or create new internship opportunities.

## INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTERS' IDEABANK, Inc. (IBIB) SESAC Radio Scholarship Grant Information







- 1. One scholarship of \$7,500 will be awarded to a junior or senior (as of September 2011) at a college or university that offers undergraduate training in radio broadcasting and/or music related programs, such as advertising, mass media, communications, journalism, or music studies. Some radio experience is considered as a positive, but is not required. This scholarship is funded by SESAC, a music licensing company, (www.sesac.com) which contracts with radio stations for the rights to broadcast their material. If you have questions, contact the radio station that offers this award; do not contact SESAC.
- 2. In order to qualify for the grant, the applicant must meet the following conditions:
- Is now attending, and is in good standing, a college or university in the United States. Freshmen students are not eligible. You must be at least a sophomore as of February 2011.
- Select a course of study relating to a career in radio broadcasting, journalism and/or music.
- Exhibit grades in previous academic work, which, in the judgment of the IBIB, are adequate to give reasonable assurance of success in earning a degree in a program, outlined above.
- Be of good moral character.
- Supply all of the information requested on the *Official Scholarship Application Form.*
- Intend to pursue a career which includes radio broadcasting, journalism or music.
- 3. Applicants must return forms to: Scholarship Committee, IBIB, PO Box 2448, Danville, VA 24541-0448, postmarked in time to arrive before the deadline (see Rule 4, below). (Street address for UPS/FedEx only: 129 Acorn Lane, Danville, VA 24541) For items sent by Express Mail, be sure to check the box that indicates NO signature is needed by the recipient. This mail is going to a Post Office box and requiring a signature only delays your entry.
- 4. ABSOLUTE DEADLINE FOR RECEIPT: All application forms, essays, and transcripts must be *received* by **March 7, 2011**. If *all* of these are not received by the deadline, the application will not be considered. Please inform your college of this deadline for your transcripts.
