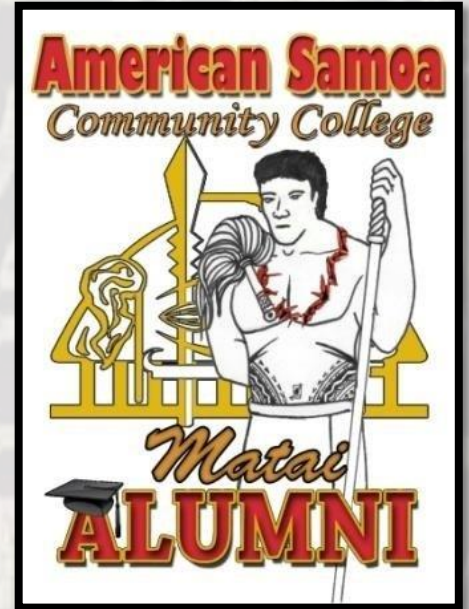


Bluesky's Future of American Samoa Scholarship 2015

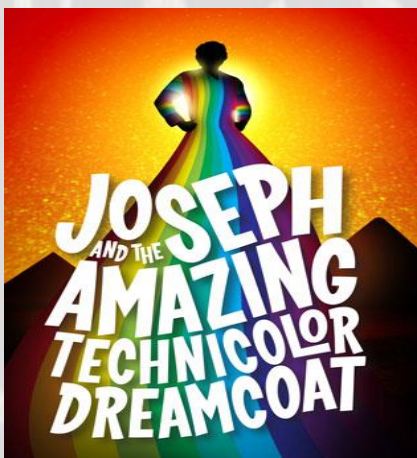
