This film, co-written by MacFarlane, Alec Sulkin and Wellesley Wild, is the uproarious sequel to the stoner fantasy-satire "Ted," from 2012. It is all about John, the irresponsible kidult guy whose emotional paralysis somehow brings to life his childhood teddy bear, which has grown into a pottymouthed slacker, bong enthusiast and loyal best friend.

In "Ted 2," Mark Wahlberg returns as John and MacFarlane again voices Ted, whose human-ursine marriage to Tami-Lynn (Jessica Barth) is under strain, as the government has blocked their attempts to adopt a child because Ted is not a "real" person. So the guys hire idealistic young lawyer Samantha L Jackson (Amanda Seyfried) to take Ted's case to the highest court in the land and prove his essential humanity. Beginning with an audacious Busby Berkeley pastiche over the opening credits, "Ted 2" is a torrent of outrageous gags: uncompromisingly silly, cheerfully offensive, and funny.




