It's all that'll matter when your dead

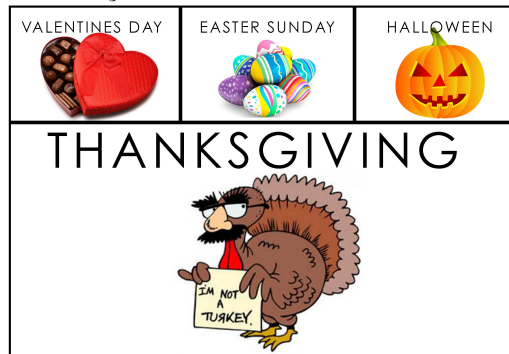
## “Super-Villians”

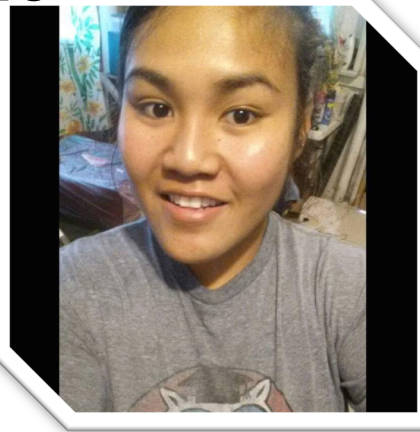

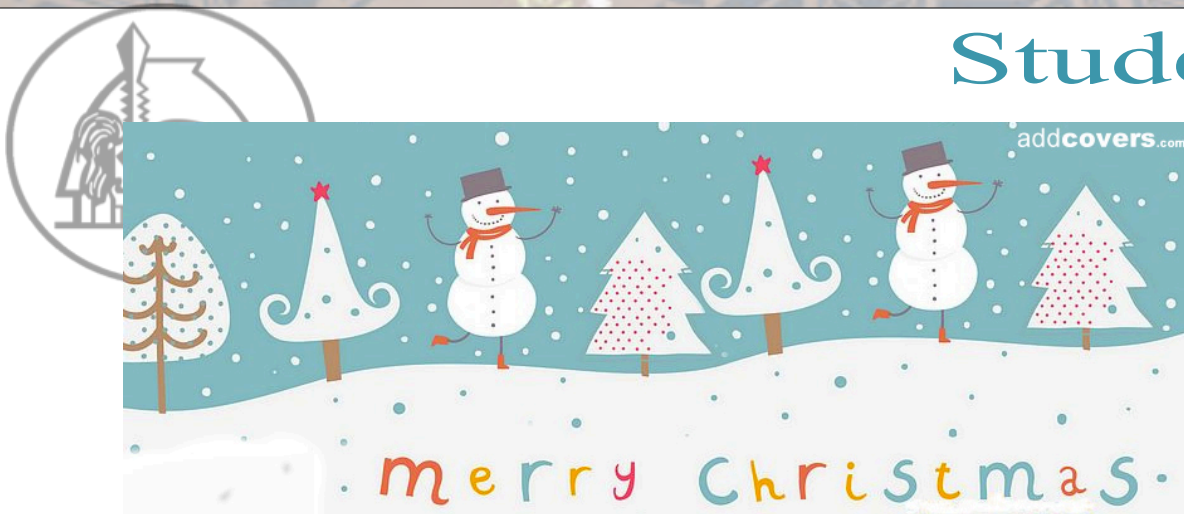
